Abstract Submission

Deadline for Abstract Submission: 1 May 2006

Delegates are invited to submit **ONE** abstract for consideration for poster presentation.

A softcopy of the abstract submission form is available at www.menopauseresearchsociety.org.sg

Guidelines for Abstract Submission

1. Abstracts must be submitted in English only.
2. All presenting authors are required to register and pay the appropriate registration fees for the poster presentation.
3. Only paid and accepted abstracts will be published in the Congress Abstract Book.
4. Submissions that do not conform to the established format will not be accepted for review by the Scientific Committee.

Abstract Content

1. Structure the text using the following headings
2. State Aims of study
3. State Methods. This section should state the research study design used (e.g. SF-36 general health survey)
4. Summarise Results obtained. This section should report the best estimate, the p-value or the 95% confidence interval for the outcome.
5. State Conclusions reached. It is not satisfactory to state "The results will be discussed".

Abstract Format

1. Abstracts should contain not more than 300 words of text in Times New Roman, size 11 pts. Do **NOT** use a smaller font size.
2. Abstract title must be in CAPITAL letters and bold print. Do not indent. Title should be concise and indicate the content of the abstract.
3. Leave one blank line between the abstract title and author/affiliation block.
4. Beginning on a separate line, list the author's names (see example) underlining that of the presenting author. Do **NOT** include degrees or professional titles (Prof, Dr, MD, etc)
5. On a separate line, type the names of departments, institutions and countries.
6. Leave one blank line between the title/author block and the body of the abstract.
7. Abstract text must be single-spaced and justified at the left margin only. Do not leave blank lines between paragraphs. Do not indent paragraphs.
8. Use of standard abbreviations is desirable. Place special or unusual abbreviations in brackets after the full word the first time it appears. Use numerals to indicate numbers, except to begin sentences.
9. Use bolded section headings where relevant.
10. The use of tables, graphs and other types of images in abstracts are not permitted.

Submission Procedures

Abstracts may be submitted in one of the following ways (please do not make multiple submissions of the same abstract). Abstracts submitted by FAX will not be considered.

Electronic mail

Abstracts may be e-mailed to as an attachment, formatted in strict accordance with the Abstract Format. Presenting author's information and title of the abstract must be included in the message of the email.

Prof David Archer

Eastern Virginia Medical School, United States & CONRAD Clinical Research Center



David Archer is Professor of Obstetrics and Gynecology at Eastern Virginia Medical School in Norfolk, Virginia. He is the Director of the Contraceptive Research and Development Program (CONRAD) Clinical Research Center as well as the Reproductive Endocrinology and Infertility Fellowship Program in the Division of Reproductive Endocrinology of the Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology. Prof Archer's current research interest is in the mechanisms and control of endometrial bleeding.

A/Prof Rodney Baber

North Shore Private Hospital, Australia



Rodney Baber is Clinical Associate Professor of Obstetrics and Gynaecology at The University of Sydney, Royal North Shore Hospital. He is also the Head of Menopause Clinic at RNSH and the Chair of Scientific Programme Organizing Committee, Australasian Menopause Society. A/Prof Baber's current researches are on the effects of SERMs on bone density and fracture, effects of phytoestrogens on bone and mammographic density and safety of tibolone after breast cancer.

Prof Susan Davis

Susan R Davis is the Professor of Women's Health, Monash University, and Director of the Monash University National Health and Medical Research Council Centre of Clinical Research Excellence in Women's Health, Victoria, Australia. She was Director of Research of the Jean Hailes Foundation 1997-2004 and held the Jean Hailes Chair of Women's Health 2003-4 having been one of the 5 founders of this organization. Prof Davis's research is focused on identifying modifiable factors that will improve the health and well-being of women in mid and later life.

Elizabeth Farrell is the Head of the Menopause Unit at Monash Medical Centre Melbourne, Honorary Senior Lecturer in the Department of Obstetrics and Gynaecology, Monash University, a Director and a consultant gynaecologist at the Jean Hailes Foundation and also in private gynaecology practice. She established the first Early Menopause Clinic in 2002 and the first Adult Turner's Long Term Care Clinic in 2004 in Australia at Monash Medical Centre.

Prof Christopher Haines

Prince of Wales Hospital, Hong Kong



Christopher Haines is a Reader in Obstetrics and Gynaecology at The Chinese University of Hong Kong and Prince of Wales Hospital in the Hong Kong New Territories. His clinical and research activities are directed in the fields of menopause and infertility. He is also an Honorary Consultant in Obstetrics and Gynaecology to the New Territories East groups of hospitals in Hong Kong and Director of the Assisted Human Reproductive Technology Unit, the Chinese University of Hong Kong.

Huang Ko-En is Professor, Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology, Chang Gung University; Head, Center for Menopause and Reproductive Medicine Research, Chang Gung Memorial Hospital; and Visiting Professor, Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology, University of Rochester. He received his training at the College of Medicine, National Taiwan University. He received his postdoctoral training in reproductive endocrinology and infertility at Chiba University, Japan and University of Rochester, USA.

Prof Dato' Khalid Bin Abdul Kadir

Dato' Khalid Abdul Kadir is Professor of Medicine, Monash University Malaysia. His main research interests are in stress and mechanisms of adaptation to stress by hormones, and

in clinical epidemiology of diabetes. He has published more than 270 scientific articles in international and local journals and chapters in 4 international textbooks on endocrinology and diabetes. In 1992, he was elected President ASEAN Federation of Endocrine Societies and 2000 he was elected as Member of Council, International Diabetes Federation representing Western Pacific countries.

Kim Won-whe is Honorary Professor at Pusan National University and Extraordinary Professor at Seoul Women's University. He was formerly President of, among others, the Pusan Society of Obstetrics and Gynecology, Obstetrics and Gynecology Society in Southern Korean Provinces, Pusan Association of Family Planning, Korean Menopause Society, and Asia Pacific Menopause Federation. He is and was on the Executive Boards of many medical societies including the Korean Society of Obstetrics and Gynecology, Korean Society of Perinatology and Korean Association of Gynecologic Endoscopy.

Khunying Kobchitt Limpaphayom is Emeritus Professor, Faculty of Medicine, Chulalongkorn University. She is also President of the Thai Menopause Society, Project Director for Cervical Cancer Prevention of Johns Hopkins Reproductive Health and President of the South East Asia Regional Association for Medical Education. She is the Past President of the Thai Osteoporosis Foundation, Asia Pacific Menopause Federation and Royal Thai College of Obstetrics and Gynaecologists.

Prof Bruno Lunenfeld

Barllan University, Israel



Bruno Lunenfeld is Professor Emeritus at the Faculty of Life Sciences Barllan University, Treasurer of the International Society of Gynecological Endocrinology and President of the International Society for the Study of the Aging Male, among others. He was the first to introduce human Menopausal Gonadotropins for

clinical use in unovulatory women and hypopituitary-hypogonadotropic men and was instrumental in the creation of an international standard for Gonadotropins, the classification of infertile patients and of the hyperstimulation syndrome.

Nik Mohd Nasri Ismail is Professor and Senior Consultant of Obstetrics & Gynaecology and Dean, Faculty of Medicine & Health Sciences, Islamic University College of Malaysia. He is also President, Malaysian Association of Maternal and Neonatal Health, Vice-President, International Association of Maternal and Neonatal Health and President, Malaysian Menopause Society. His main interest areas are in menopausal problems and HRT, maternal and foetal health medicine and family planning.

René Rizzoli is an internist and endocrinologist, with a subspecialty focus on metabolic bone diseases, osteoporosis and disorders of mineral metabolism. Dr Rizzoli is also chairman of the Committee of Scientific Advisors and member of the Executive Committee of the International Osteoporosis Foundation, and president of the Swiss Association against Osteoporosis.

Ego Seeman is an endocrinologist at the Austin hospital and Associate Professor in the Department of Medicine, University of Melbourne.
